Family Tree:

Term 4: Week 2 Homework Project

Immigration Interview:

Choose a family member who has migrated from one place to another and interview them about their experience.

Record their answers.

3. What were some challenges you faced?
4. What opportunities did your new home have?
5. Did you take any risks when you migrated?

As you interview your family member, ask other questions that you are interested in. Record these new questions and answers too!

Term 4: Week 3 Homework Project

Immigration Interview (Email):

Choose a family member who has migrated from one place to another and email them, using appropriate email etiquette taught in ICT.

Remember to include: greeting, body paragraph, closing remark, your name

Include the following questions in your email (body paragraph):

1. Where did you move from?
2. Where did you move to, and why?
3. What were some challenges you faced?
4. What opportunities did your new home have?
5. Did you take any risks when you migrated?

As you interview your family member, ask other questions that you are interested in. Record these new questions and answers too!

Immigration Project (Push Factors):

Research the real world problems that forced people to leave your immigrant's home country.

Include the dates of the events that happened, as well as a short description of the event.

Term 4: Week 6 Homework Project

Immigration Project (Journey):

Your immigrant has begun their journey to their new home country.

Imagine that you are an immigrant and have to leave your house within the next 15 minutes. You are allowed to bring the paper bag provided at school.

1. Decide what the most important things are that you will bring. They all MUST fit inside the bag.
2. Remove everything from the bag and arrange the items into a rectangle.
3. Take a photo of the items and then add it to your Google doc.
